celebration, nothing could be further from the truth.


Several weeks before her 10th birthday, Tess Frana came home from school and told her mother, Terri, that instead of receiving presents at her upcoming birthday party, she wanted her classmates at All Souls Catholic School to donate to the Brian Christopher Lanier Wings of Hope Foundation. Her mother was not at all surprised.

"Tess is just like that... all heart for others!" beams Terri. "As a member of student council, she had just heard one of her teachers make a presentation about what wonderful work the organization is doing."

"When I first heard about Wings of Hope, it made me feel sad to learn that kids aren't allowed to stay in foster care after they turn 18, when they don't have anyplace to go," says Tess. "I just wanted to do something to help."

The response to Tess's generosity was immediate. Many of her classmates' parents emailed Terri, expressing their admiration for her daughter's altruism. Her classmates were also quick to speak up, expressing how very special they thought it was for her to think about and put other people first.

Tess hopes her story will encourage others to take the initiative in doing something for those less fortunate. "I want them to think about helping other people, too," Tess says, adding, "Many people don't think they can do that much, but one person can do a lot."





And, in fact, that was the case. By the end of the party, Tess had raised \$350, which she presented to Kathy Gautsch, the founder of Wings of Hope, and her husband, Tony, the next day!

In 1996, Kathy started Wings of Hope after the tragic death of her son, Brian, as a way to commemorate his care and concern for atrisk young people.

"It's amazing to me that someone Tess's age already gets it," says Kathy. "Tess cares about the same young people my son Brian cared about – and that touches my heart."
